This model is free of charges for both readers and authors, community-driven, and supported by publishing initiatives run for or by researchers.

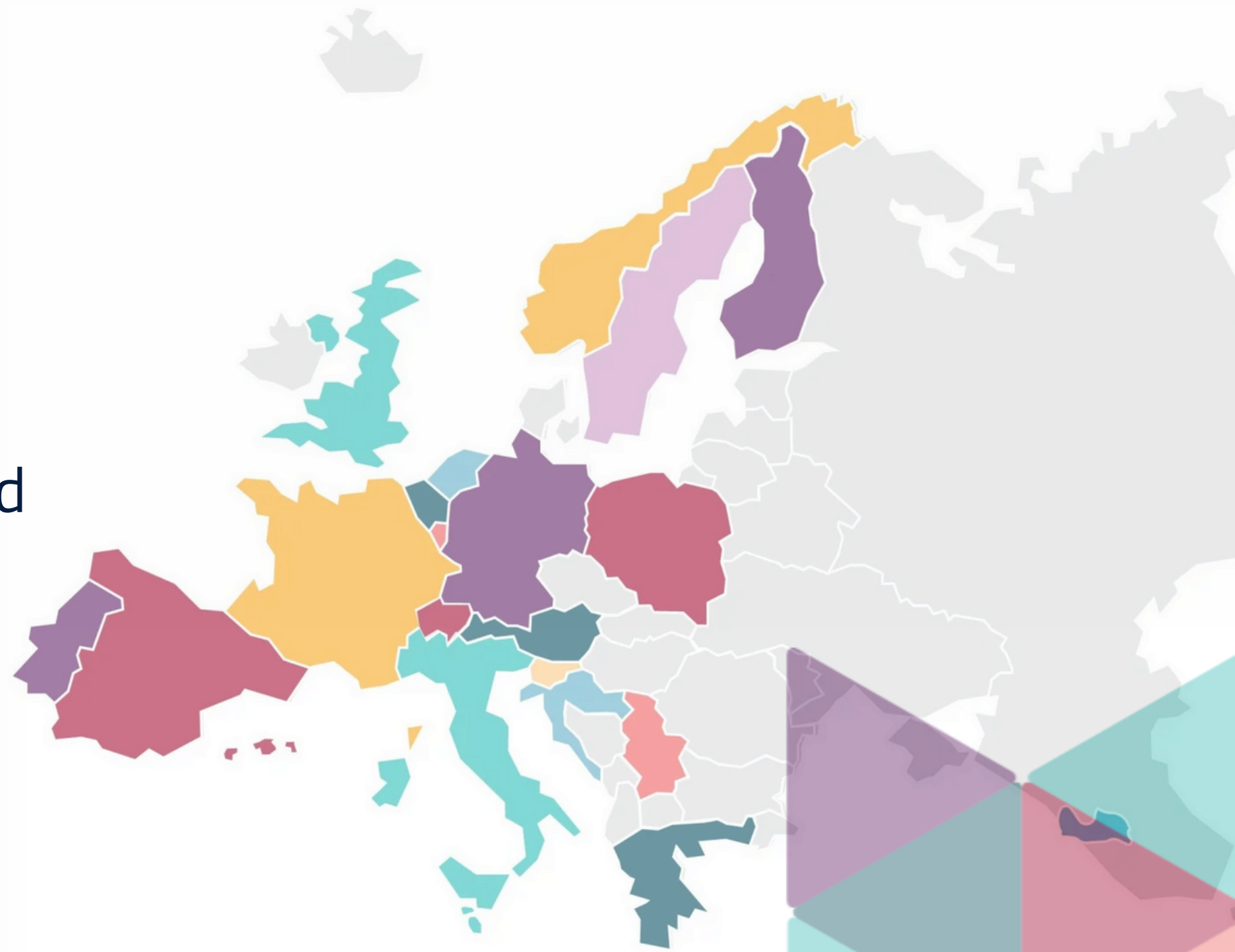


OPERAS

OPERAS is a research infrastructure dedicated to open scholarly communication. It brings together over 60 institutions from more than 20 countries and has been active since 2017.

OPERAS supports infrastructure for diamond open access through participation in projects such as DIAMAS and CRAFT-OA, as well as in the European Diamond Capacity Hub initiative.

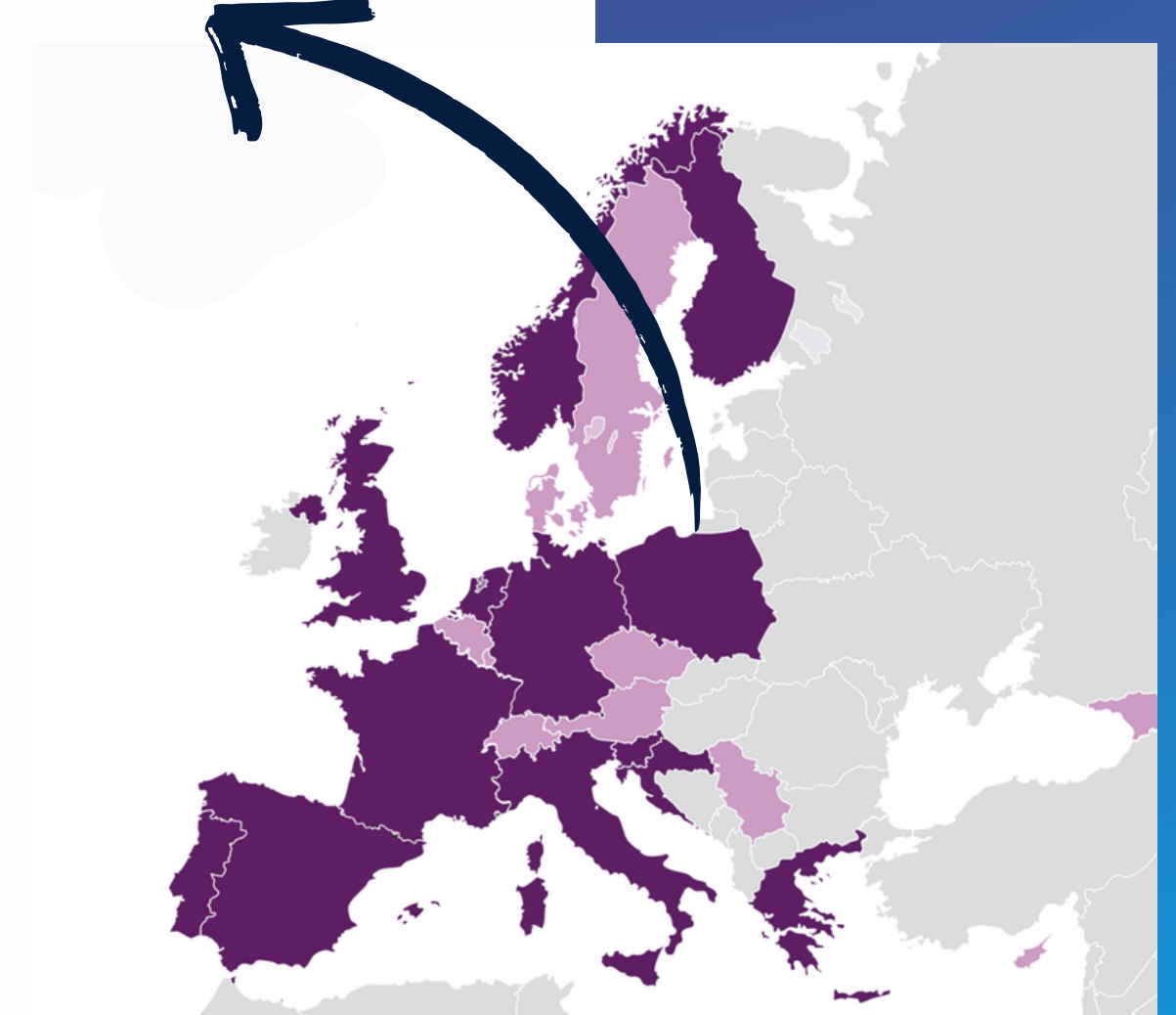
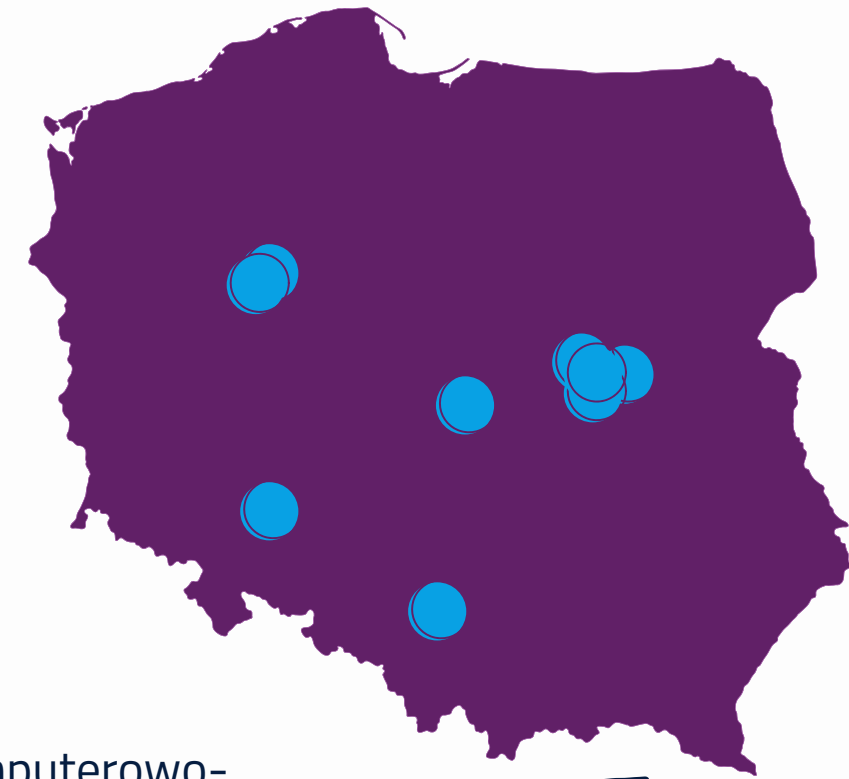


OPERAS-PL

It has been operating since June 2021. Its activities include:

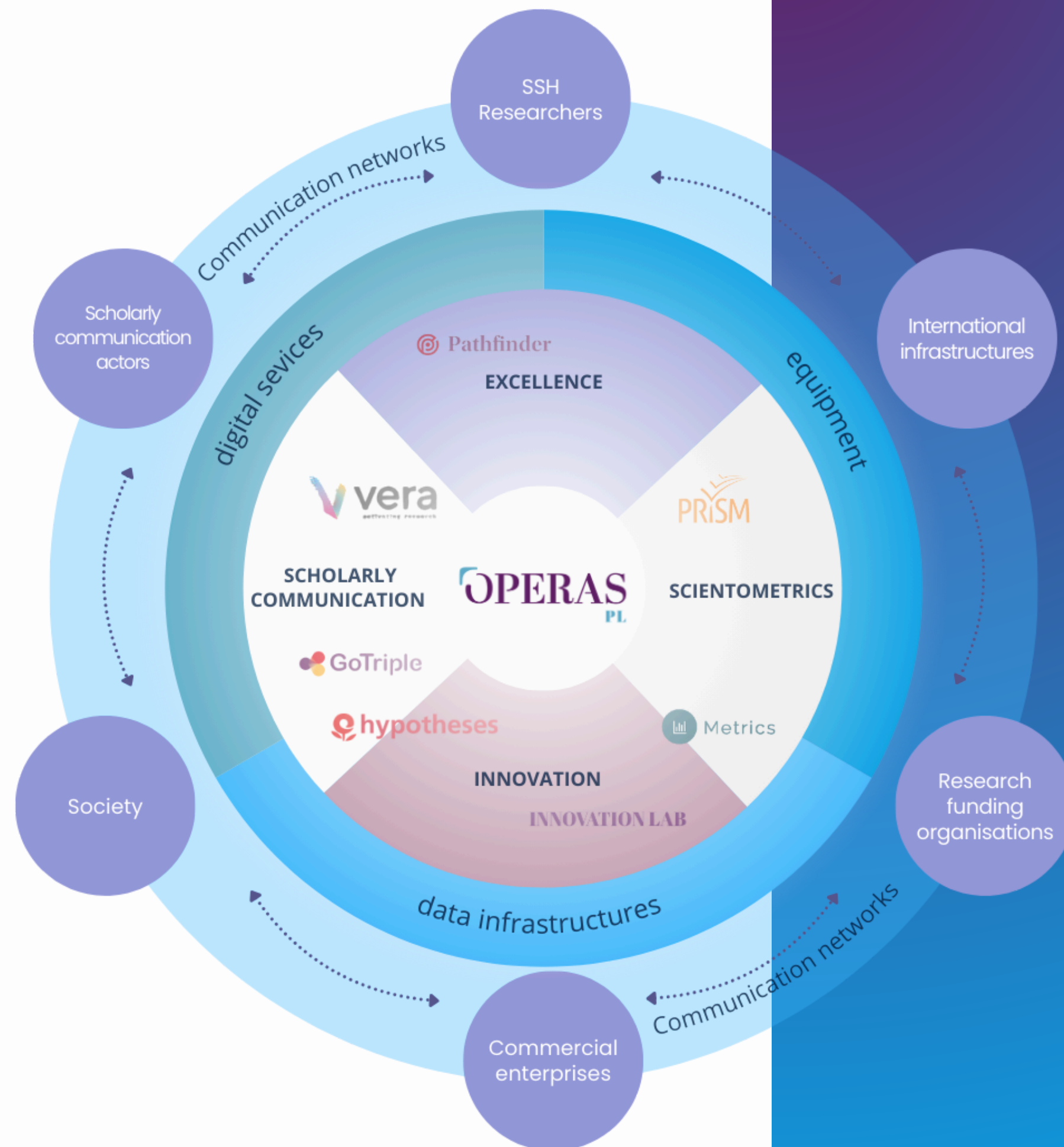
- research on open access models for scholarly journals and books,

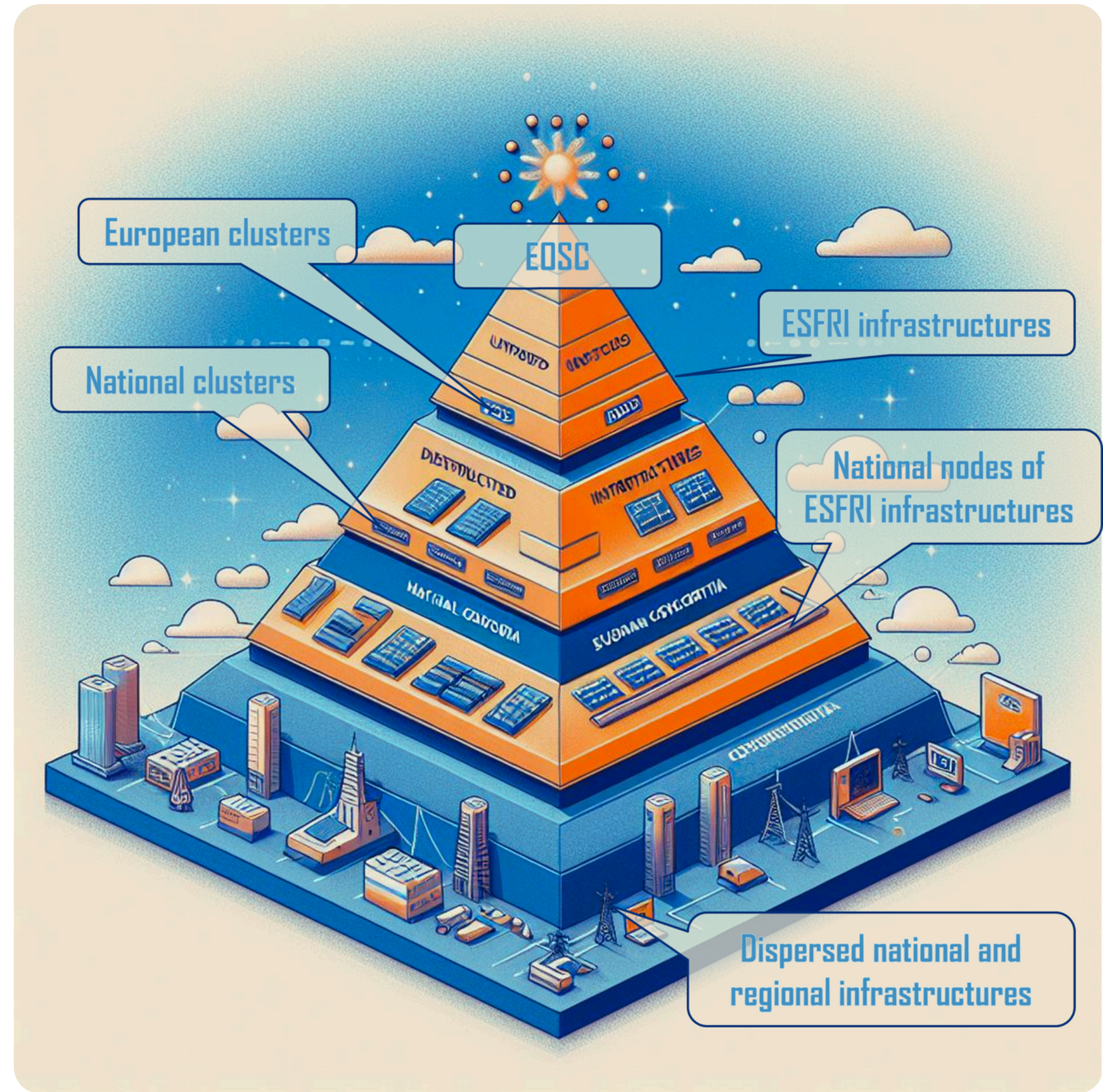
